## SWIFT COUNTY FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Board of Directors reserves the final \& absolute right to interpret these rules \& regulations \& determine all matters, questions \& differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of incidents at the fair.

1. The Agricultural Society reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as in its judgement may deem advisable.
2. The Swift County Agricultural Society wishes to promote a wholesome and educational event for the entire family. All exhibits and displays are subject to review by the Agricultural Society. Any items or material deemed as inappropriate for display must be removed by exhibitor upon request by fair officials.
3. Exhibitors of livestock or any person carrying passengers and doing general work to and from the fairgrounds or selling goods of any kind will be required to purchase a season pass, which admits the exhibitor to the grounds any time during the fair.
4. All Campers will pay $\$ 200$ per unit for the fair. The camping fee does not include entrance to the fair.
5. The Swift County Fair Association does not provide insurance on exhibits and cannot be held responsible for loss in case of fire, but every precaution will be taken to prevent such an occurrence.
6. Visitors at the fair are urged to use every means to avoid accidents. The Swift County Fair Association does not assume any responsibility for any accidents.
7. No dogs/animals are allowed on the fairgrounds except for service dogs/animals with service registration, and in designated areas only. Dogs/animals may be allowed when part of an exhibition or demonstration authorized by the Swift County Fair Board. Carnival owner/operators, camping-dogs must be housed during fair hours.
8. No roller skates, in-line skates, skate boards, bicycles, scooters, golf carts, ATV's or other wheeled vehicles are allowed on the Swift County Fairgrounds without the consent of the Board of Directors.
9. There will be no personal vehicles or support vehicles allowed inside the grounds for any reason during fair hours. Any unauthorized vehicles parked inside the fairgrounds will be towed at owner's expense. Only vehicles authorized and permitted by the Swift County Fair Board will be allowed. Permits to be obtained from the fair board office prior to vehicle usage. No underage operators will be allowed to operate these permitted vehicles.
10. No person or group of persons shall banner, picket, march, protest, demonstrate or caucus on the Swift County Fairgrounds before or during the fair in any manner that interferes with the convenience or safety of any county fair patron, exhibitor or employee. Anyone doing so will be made to leave the Swift County Fairgrounds and state in a space designated by the Board of Directors outside the fenced perimeter at the farthest SW corner of the fairgrounds.
11. Exhibitors wishing to park their cattle trailers at the fairgrounds for the duration of the fair may do so but in a specific area of the grounds designated by the Board of Directors for that purpose.
12. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds except from their places of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisements, bills, cards, etc., other than within the space occupied by exhibitors, is strictly prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers, heralds, etc. will not under any circumstances be permitted. Anyone violating this rule will be liable to a fine or expulsion from the grounds as the board may elect.
13. Smoking and E-cigarettes are not allowed in any building or rides on the fairgrounds or within 50 feet of any building doorway.
14. Persons having claims against the Swift County Agricultural Society must present them in writing to the secretary within fifteen days after the last day of the fair.

## SWIFT COUNTY FAIR OPEN CLASS EXHIBITS

## Entry Time

1. All entries, including online registrations must be entered between $10: 00$ am to 6:00 pm Wed. , August 16, 2023.
2. No exhibits will be admitted after that time.
3. Judging will take place Wednesday night and Thursday morning.

## Exhibit Rules

1. Superintendents will be at the grounds Wednesday, August 16, 2022 to whom exhibits must be taken. No exhibits will be received before 10:00 am or after 6:00 pm.
2. No exhibitor will be allowed to make more than one entry in any one lot. Articles in sets cannot compete for single premiums.
3. Stock and art must be entered in the name of the bona-fide owner.
4. Grain, vegetables, fruit and dairy products must have been raised or made by the exhibitor thereof during the past year.
5. Every article in competition must correspond in number and description with the premium list and be in proper class in order to obtain premiums.
6. No animal or article will be assigned a place on the grounds until entry has been made.
7. Each entry tag shall be securely attached to the entry itself or the stall, pen or receptacle in which it is shown.
8. Exhibition of articles not competing for premiums must be arranged for at time of registration.
9. The superintendents have the right to disqualify exhibits that are not the work of the exhibitor.
10. No prize ribbons or cards received at any other or preceding fairs of any bills of advertising will be allowed to be attached to exhibit stall or distributed upon the grounds.
11. The same article or item cannot be entered in more than one class at the fair.
12. The Swift County Fair Association does not provide insurance on exhibits and cannot be held responsible for loss or damage, but every precaution will be taken to prevent such an occurrence.
13. Visitors at the fair are urged to use every means to avoid accidents occurring at the fair as the Swift County Fair Association does not assume responsibility.

## Awards

1. The awards in open class entries will be designated by ribbons, stickers or cards as follows: $1^{\text {st }}$ Premium - Blue; $2^{\text {nd }}-$ Red; $3^{\text {rd }}-$ White.
2. $1^{\text {st }}$ Premium is awarded $\$ 2.50 ; 2^{\text {nd }}$ is $\$ 2.00$; and $3^{\text {rd }}$ is $\$ 1.50$ unless otherwise noted.
3. Grand Champion Ribbons will be awarded to exhibits of exceptional merit. Champion - $\$ 5.00$, Reserve - $\$ 3.00$.
4. Premiums will not be awarded unless the judge deems the exhibit worthy.
5. When there is but one entry in a class, prize money and ribbons shall be awarded as merits of exhibits may warrant.
6. All interference by exhibitors to influence or dictate the decision of the judges shall be sufficient cause for excluding his or her entries from competition and should be reported to the secretary through the superintendent of the division.
7. No appeal from the decision of the awarding committee shall be allowed. The decision of the judges is final.
8. Premiums will not be awarded to articles or animals of inferior merit, although there may be no competition.

## Release of Exhibits

1. All entries will be released at $6: 00$ pm on Sunday, August $20^{\text {th }}, 2023$.
2. Checks to all premium winners will be handed out Sunday at 6:00pm.
3. Premiums and prizes will not be paid on any entries leaving before assigned release time.
4. Any payment discrepancies must be resolved within 2 weeks of the end date of the fair.

## Open Class Tips for Entry

## Floriculture

- Flowers will not be judged by containers except when specified. No Styro containers or pop cans.
- Antiques and costly containers are discouraged.
- Please remove ALL foliage below water line.


## CANNED \& PRESERVED FOOD -

## Product Appearance Requirements.

- Pieces should be uniform in size and packed snugly but allow for circulation of liquids.
- Products should be free from defects of blemishes, strings, stems, seeds, pits and peels. Some recipes may require stems, pits and/or peels to remain; this is acceptable if the recipe is in keeping with approved guidelines.
- Liquids should cover the product within headspaceguidelines \& should be clear \& free from cloudiness \& small particles.
- Product should retain its natural characteristic color or as nearly that of standard cooked product \& be free from undue color loss.
- Texture should be tender but not over-cooked.
- Product should maintain its shape and size appropriate for recipe and preparation method.


## Bands.

- Bands should be in place for transporting home canned products; however, bands may be removed when presented for judging. Replacing the bands for display is optional.


## Processing method and time.

- All entries must be heat- processed following canning guidelines.
- If product was not processed according to recommendations, it must be disqualified.


## Labeling.

- Entries must be labeled with product name, date of preparation, processing method and processing time.


## BAKED GOODS

- All entries must be a product of the exhibitor and must be a product of a home kitchen.
- All entries must be on a white plate in a zip-loc bag.
- NO COMMERCIAL MIXES WILL BE ACCEPTED.


## Antiques

- Must be at least 50 years old or of collectible value.
- Will be judged on quality, beauty, condition and value.
- Only one entry per exhibitor in each lot. Articles previously entered cannot be entered again.
- We are not responsible for damaged or stolen items, even though the building and grounds are patrolled at all times. All items will be entered at exhibitor's own risk.


## Photography

- No larger than $8 \times 10$ size, including borders. - All photographs must be matted (construction paper acceptable).
- No glass or frame. - Clear plastic suggested to prevent scratching or damage during exhibition.
- Work should not have been exhibited at this fair before.
- Write exposure information if known on back of photo or on tag attached.
- Bring card with name, address and categories to be entered to facilitate recording.
- Please have your name on the back of the work for added identification.
- Only one entry per lot and a maximum of 15 entries per exhibitor. Photographs must be taken by exhibitor.
- No professionally made or on-line photo books.
